Overview of Learning in Reception 2016 - 2017

Personal, Social and Emotional Development will include:

- Being confident to explain own knowledge and understanding.
- Taking steps to resolve conflicts with other children.
- Showing sensitivity to others' needs and feelings, and forming positive relationships with adults and other children.
- An awareness of boundaries and behavioural expectations and understanding consequences.
- Talking about how they feel
- Developing the confidence to speak to others about their own needs, wants, interests and opinions.

Communication and Language will include:

- Developing attention span and listening skills in a range of situations, such as on the carpet and in small groups.
- Listening to, and following, instructions.
- Listening and responding to others.
- Answering 'how' and 'why' questions about their experiences.
- Extending the children's range of vocabulary.
- Speaking in full sentences.
- Using the correct tenses (past, present and future).
- Developing an understanding of how we use our voice to speak to others.

Physical Development will include:

- Experimenting with different ways of moving.
- Moving around and negotiating space.
- Developing co-ordination.
- Using different tools (e.g. scissors, pens).
- Writing and forming letters
- Developing pencil grip.
- Keeping healthy.
- Developing an understanding of safety.

Understanding the World will include:

- Learning about and appreciating different festivals from around the world
- Looking at similarities and differences in people, places and the world around us.
- Using a range of technology.

Expressive Arts and Design will include:

- Exploring instruments and songs.
- Experimenting with colour, sound and movement.
- Selecting and using their own tools and materials.
- Creating stories using their own ideas.
